SUMMARIES:

2004: Larry Nelson rallied from seven strokes back and made a five-foot birdie putt on the first playoff hole to beat Hale Irwin. Nelson began the day in a tie for 14th but made four birdies and a bogey on the outward nine. After tying Peter Jacobsen for the lead, Nelson found water on 17 for bogey but recovered with a birdie at 18.

2005: Ailing with a touch of the flu early in the week, Mark McNulty used a pair of eagles in the final round. McNulty jumped into contention with a 20-foot eagle putt at No.2 but didn't take his first lead Sunday until he made birdie at the par-3 ninth. Brad Bryant, the 36-hole leader, dropped out of contention after a double-bogey at 16. McNulty eagled 13, birdied 16 and 18 to secure the win.

2006: Jay Haas celebrated his 28th wedding anniversary by winning his fourth title of the year. Haas separated himself from the competition Saturday, posting a tournament record 9-under-par 63 that included birdies on five of his final six holes. He started Sunday with a five shot lead and 17-under through five holes when heavy rains forced officials to suspend and later cancel the final round.

2007: Bernhard Langer won his first Champions Tour title in just his fourth start shattering tournament records. He started with a course record 10-under-par 62 and closed with a 64 for a 25-under total of 191. He became the first German player to win on the Champions Tour.

2008: Bernhard Langer became the first player in tournament history to successfully defend his title. After trailing by four strokes in the first round, a second-round 67 moved him into a tie for first. Despite a one-stroke penalty early in final round, he was able to hold off Lonnie Nielsen for the trophy.

2009: John Cook opened with a 65 to stay within one stroke of Dan Forsman. Forsman, would also lead after the second round. However, it was Cook who stayed out of trouble with a pair of birdies and no bogeys on the back-nine Sunday afternoon. Several in contention, including Forsman and Jay Haas recorded bogeys coming in and Cook survived for victory.

2010: Fred Couples shook off a double-bogey on the front nine (No. 8) by playing the back nine in 7-under par 29 to steamroll past a faltering Corey Pavin for the 2010 title. Trailing Pavin by two strokes after the 10th hole, Couples played the final eight in 7 under.

2011: On the strength of a birdie late Saturday on the 17th hole and a few miscues from other competitors, Brad Faxon put himself in position to win the Insperity Championship. On Sunday, a deluge of rain did the rest of the work. By winning, Faxon joined Bernhard Langer as the second player to make the Insperity Championship his first victory on the Champions Tour.

2012: Twenty years ago, Fred Funk earned his first PGA TOUR victory in Houston. On the same course in May, he collected a comeback victory of sorts on the Champions Tour. Funk birdied four of the final five holes, including a 2-foot birdie putt on the 54th hole to finish 14-under-par 202. Funk secured what turned out to be the winning moment when he hit a 5-iron on the 18th hole for the 2-foot birdie opportunity.

2013: On Cinco de Mayo Esteban Toledo became the first Mexican to win on the Champions Tour following a final-round 67 that put him in a three-way playoff. Toledo outlasted Mike Goodes and Gene Sauers to win in a thrilling three-hole playoff.

2014: Bernhard Langer became the first player in tournament history to win three times and did so in an eight-year span. Langer held off hard-charging Fred Couples in the final round to win by one stroke.

Categories of Eligibility for the Insperity Invitational

1. Those players eligible for Champions Tour events who are members of the World Golf Hall of Fame.
2. Winners of major championships on the Champions Tour (Senior PGA Championship, the Senior Open Championship, U.S. Senior Open, Constellation Senior Players Championship, Regions Tradition) in the preceding five calendar years and the current year.
3. Top 20 available players from the final Previous Year's Money List provided such players are 50th or better on such money list.
4. Top 20 players available from the All-Time Money List as of commitment deadline, not otherwise exempt above, provided such players are 70th or higher on such money list.
5. The top player from the prior year's European Senior Tour, PGA Australia Legends Tour and Asian Senior Tour Orders of Merit.
6. Winners of cosponsored or approved Champions Tour tournaments since the prior year's Insuperity Invitational.
7. The top player from the most recent Champions Tour National Qualifying Tournament.
8. In order to fill the field of 81 players, at the invitation of the host organization, players not otherwise exempt for the Insuperity Invitational, provide all of such players shall be winners of a PGA TOUR, Champions Tour, European Tour or European Senior Tour tournament. Or, players who have a minimum of five wins on their respective home Tour.
