

ROUND 3 INTERVIEW: DAVID FROST

Q. Hello again. So, a pretty good day out there. Obviously, 13, you were telling me yesterday you went for two, and you made a bogey there in the midst of four birdies.

DAVID FROST: You know, I was a bit closer to the green than I was yesterday, and I thought well, you know, I got to go. And I actually I got very lucky because my ball didn't end up going in the water, and it stayed up and I hit it on and three putted from longrange.

DAVID FROST: So I was kind of struggling on the front nine, and David Graham gave me a little pointer the other day on my grip, and I kept checking my grip out, you know, before I hit the ball, and I found that I was crouching, looking at my grip all the time

So I raised my chin up to give myself some room to swing my arms under my chin, by just raising my head, and I just played great golf the last eight holes. So, you know, but I'm sure there will be something else next week.

Q. Every week you learn new tricks, right?

DAVID FROST: Yes.

Q. So are you going to send any wine to David graham for the tip?

DAVID FROST: I'll have to. I'll have to. I'll have to send something to the club. He's a member where I am in Dallas at Preston Trail.
